

UNIVERSITY AT BUFFALO (UB) ACCESS TO COLLEGE EXCELLENCE (ACE) PROGRAM FACT SHEET

What is ACE?

- The Access to College Excellence (ACE) Program is a mandatory support services program designed to assist students during their first two years of study and with making the transition from high school to college
- Students are selected for the ACE Program through the University at Buffalo (UB) Admissions process. Eligibility is based on SAT scores, high school averages and other personal attributes
- Program staff will work closely with you to identify resources and maximize your college experience, from enrollment to graduation.
- Once students are admitted into the University through the ACE Program, we require them to have a minimum of three (3) contacts with their ACE advisor each semester.
- All ACE Program students are required to attend a mandatory meeting held during the third week of the fall semester as well as attend a minimum of two workshops each semester.
